We would therefore welcome contributions on first and second language acquisition and attrition (including sign language and gesture), bilingualism, language contact, pidgins and creoles, Language for Specific Purposes, instructed language learning, language technology, mother-tongue education, lexicology, terminology and translation. It is our intention that one issue per year will be thematically organized.

Whatever the topic, our first criterion for selection is that papers should be theoretically grounded and based on careful research and method.
