The South-East Asian Biographical Archive (SEABA) comprises approximately 85,000 biographical entries on more than 55,000 persons. It is a key to the history of this region, covering Brunei, Cambodia, Indonesia, Laos, Malaysia, Myanmar, the Philippines, Singapore, Thailand, and Vietnam.

The biographies – from 306 reference works – demonstrate the effects of the diverse history that has had on the composition of modern society in these countries. Colonial officials, military persons and people with different religious beliefs and coming from a variety of social, geographical and cultural groups can be found alongside one another in the South-East Asian Biographical Archive, and mirror the diversity of this region.

10,000 entries in the original languages have received summaries written especially for the SEABA, in English, making these sources available to non-Asian-language speakers.

The Chinese Biographical Archive (CBA) contains 114,167 biographical entries on 69,682 individuals from the area in which the Chinese culture prevails, stretching from the earliest periods of history right up to the present. Besides giving access to more than four thousand years of Chinese history, the biographies also elucidate the manifold links between China and its Asian neighbours, as well as Europe and America. The CBA includes persons who have influenced politics, economy, science, religion and culture in China during its varied history. 44,000 entries from Chinese standard works were provided with abstracts written in English, specifically for the CBA, making the biographical material accessible to readers without any knowledge of Asian languages.

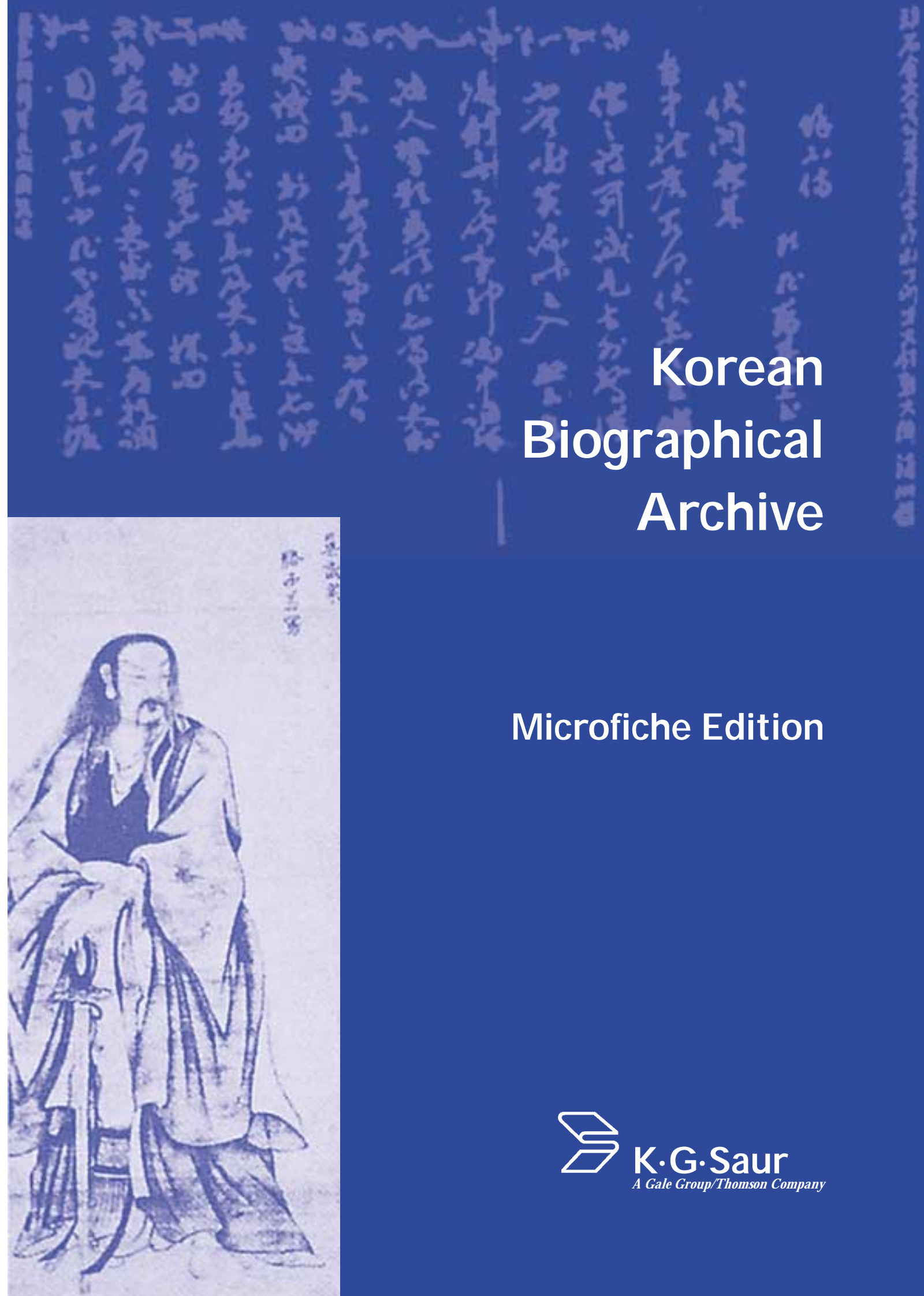

The Japanese Biographical Archive is an accumulation of c. 87 biographical reference works on Japan, published from the mid-17th century up to 1998. It contains biographies on women and men from all periods of Japan's history, from its earliest times right down to the present day. It includes about 65,000 individuals who shaped the political, economic, academic, religious and cultural life of Japan during the varied course of its history. The Archive also covers non-Japanese individuals who lived and worked in Japan, for example missionaries, discoverers, explorers, adventurers and traders. In total there are about 85,000 biographies. The biographies are written in Japanese, English, German, French and other Western languages. In order to make the biographical material accessible to readers without a knowledge of Japanese, approximately 25,000 entries from Japanese standard works will be provided with abstracts specifically written for the JaBA in English.

Closely linked to the political opening of the region, economic expansion in Asia has led to a rise in interest in the respective countries and a corresponding rise in the demand for information about their cultures and people. Korea is no exception, especially when seen in the light of recent developments. For about five decades the division of the country into two states with different social structures led to a complete breach in communication.

In the Korean Biographical Archive (KBA) personalities from North and South Korea are united. About 110,000 biographical entries from roughly 125 source works in more than 270 volumes, published up to the year 2000, have been cumulated. Due to the sources obtained it was also possible to include biographical material from scientific journals and year books.

Korea is one of the oldest states in east Asia, and on account of its geographical position forms a natural bridge between the Asian continent and the Japanese islands. As a result it has always enjoyed active cultural exchange with its neighbours and at the same time has continually been involved in disputes with them. With the biographies of women and men from all epochs of its varied history, the Korean Biographical Archive does justice to Korea's historical development. KBA covers more than 40,000 people: from

King Tangun, founder of the legendary kingdom of Chosŏn, and King Sejong, who introduced the Korean alphabet in the mid 15th century, to the political representatives of the country divided since 1948. Prominent figures from all social strata and professional groups are represented through their biographies. Korean emigrants are also among those considered, along with foreign scientists, missionaries, diplomats, artists, industrialists etc. who have influenced Korea's development.

The biographies are written in Korean, German, English, Russian and French. In order to make the biographical material accessible for users without any knowledge of the Korean language, the original texts from Korean standard works for about 20,000 entries are presented together with English summaries, written especially for the Korean Biographical Archive.

No other biographical work covering Korea's history compares with the Korean Biographical Archive in terms of comprehensiveness, the material and the useful manner in which the contents are disclosed. The ease of access to the biographical texts which would otherwise be widely dispersed and in many cases difficult to obtain, is a valuable addition not only for historical-political research, but also for the study and documentation of current issues and events.

자안 子安 1240(고종 27)~1327(충숙왕 14). 고려 중기의 고승(高僧). 상운(相運)의 제자(弟子). 일선군(一善郡) 출신. 뒤에 이통(李通)과 함께 미수(彌叟)라고 하였다. 태어난 지 수일 만에 어머니가 죽어 이모가 길렀다. 9세 때 《시경》과 《서경》을 통달하였고, 13세 때 원흥사(元興寺) 중연(宗然)을 스승으로 모시고 중이 되어 주축계(具足戒)를 받은 뒤 경론(經論)을 배웠다. 1258년(고종 45) 선봉장(善峰場)에 나가 상공과(上品科)에 급제한 뒤 국녕사(國寧寺)에 머물렀고, 1258년(원종 9) 상종대사(上宗大師)가 되어 《유사론(唯識論)》을 강의하였는데, 이 강의는 고려 불교계의 최귀한 일로 평가받았다. 그 뒤 용신사(龍神寺)에 있을 때 주좌(住座)가 되었고, 장의사(莊義寺)에 있을 때 승통(僧統)이 되었다. 그 뒤 법주사에 있을 때에는 후회들을 위하여 장소(障所)를 지어 세상에 유포시키도록 하라는 왕명에 따라 아직 주석서가 없는 92권의 경론을 해설하였다. 중흥사(重興寺)에 있을 때에는 중신왕으로부터 석교도승통(釋敎都僧統)의 직위와 함께 원명대사(圓明大師)라는 칭호를 받았다. 유가사

(龍加寺)에 주석할 때에는 《대만아경(大曼野經)》 신해품(信解品)을 해석하여 당시의 강사(講師)들을 깨우치고, 《심지관경(心地觀經)》을 주석하여 해석상의 문제를 두고 논쟁하던 것을 그치게 하였다. 원은 크게 존경하여 그가 머물던 장의사를 일곱번이나 찾아갔고, 그에게 대자운종사 개내삼학도단주 대장외사주지 오교도승통 공지도 변불각보명대사(大慈恩寂靜閣內三學都壇主大莊嚴等住持五敎都僧統妙解佛覺明大師)라는 호와 양가도승통(兩街都僧統)의 직책을 내려 승정(僧政)을 담당하게 하였다. 자운종사라는 호는 그가 법상종(法相宗)의 대가임을 알려주는 자료가 되고 있다. 충숙왕은 그를 왕실내의 내전참회사(內殿(兼)懺師)로 불하여 왕사(王師)로서 대우하였고, 또 왕의 침으로 대민천사(大覺天寺)에 들어가 삼가장소(三寶藏所)를 강의하였으며, 1324년(충숙왕 11)에는 통화사(通華寺)에서 오공전각보원주에 국
