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I. Editorial policy

Unpublished material

Submission of a manuscript to *Issues in Legal Scholarship* implies that the work described is not copyrighted, published, or submitted elsewhere, except in abstract form. The corresponding author should ensure that all co-authors approve the manuscript before its submission.

Ethical conduct of research

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All manuscripts must be written in clear and concise English. If you have reasons to doubt your proficiency with respect to spelling, grammar, etc. (e.g., because English is not your native language), then you may wish to employ—at your expense—the services of a professional language editor.

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Manuscripts should be submitted as DOCX (Word), RTF, or LaTeX files. Manuscripts submitted in LaTeX format should also include a PDF export of the document as a reference file. If possible, authors should provide large and/or complicated tables as supplementary material or an appendix. Tables cannot contain lists and should not contain images or dashed lines. All figures and tables should be cited in the text and should have a caption/legend.

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Each manuscript should be accompanied by a cover letter briefly highlighting the main features of the contribution.

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Authors need to make sure that correct scientific nomenclature is used (e. g., for units, Latin organism names). Authors are asked to follow the recommendations of the:

CONTENT AND STRUCTURE

1. Introduction (titling this section is optional)
2. Subsequent sections which include tables, references to figures and figure captions.
3. Appendices (if any).

5. References - Include a proper bibliography following the guidelines in the References section below.
6. Please supply figures in separate files, not embedded in the text. Please see the "Tables, Figures, and Graphs" section below for more detailed instructions regarding figure submission.

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- Only use Unicode fonts (e.g. Times New Roman, Arial)

Review articles aim to summarize recent significant advances in research. Authors should strive for brevity and clarity. The final structure of the review will depend on the focus, but wherever possible the following sections should be included: Title page, abstract, keywords, list of abbreviations, and an introduction; further, body of review, expert opinion, outlook, highlights, and references. A nomenclature list at the end of the paper is recommended when many symbols are included in the text.

In-text citations should be indicated by author and date (1 author: Miller 2013; 2 authors: Miller and Jones 2009; 3 or more authors: Miller et al. 2014). References should be formatted according to APA style, 5th Ed., as per <http://www.apastyle.org/>

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Submit tables on separate pages or as separate files and number them consecutively using Arabic numerals. Provide a short descriptive title, column headings, and (if necessary) footnotes to make each table self-explanatory. Refer to tables in the text as Table 1, etc. Use Table 1, etc. in the table legends. Especially large or complex Tables should be

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Graphical abstract figure and text for the table of contents (optional): A graphical abstract figure (minimum resolution of 300 dpi) and a graphical abstract text (consisting of the article title, all author names without affiliations, and a one sentence summary of the manuscript, followed by 3–5 keywords) for the table of contents may be provided. These elements are meant to provide the reader a summary of the research reviewed in the paper.

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Halftone figures (grayscale and color) should have a **minimum resolution of 300 dpi and be of good contrast; recommended file format: tif.** Authors are encouraged to submit illustrations in color if necessary for conveying their scientific content. Publication of color figures is provided free of charge.

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- When proofing your document, pay particular attention to the rendering of the mathematics, especially symbols and notation drawn from other than standard fonts.

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
