

Abbreviations

Abbreviations for ancient Greek authors and works follow the Greek-English Dictionary by Liddell, Scott and Jones [LSJ]; we use the abbreviation *Juv.* to refer to the treatise *De Juventute et Senectute, De Vita et Morte, De Respiratione* as a whole.

Works by Galen and Hippocrates are being cited according to the CMG abbreviations as reported in Fichtner's bibliographies (<http://cmg.bbaw.de/online-publications/hippokrates-und-galenbibliographie-fichtner> [last visited April 2020]).
