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AIMS AND SCOPE

Reviews on Environmental Health is a quarterly periodical which is intended to fill the need for short, highly-specialized reviews in the fields of environmental health and medicine and pollution control. Such questions as: ecological aspects of water, air and soil pollution; pollution monitoring techniques and pollution control technology; and environmental medicine, are among the range of subjects to be covered by this broad-spectrum review journal dealing with the interrelations between environment and man.

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Each major article will be preceded by a synopsis. Following are guidelines for composition of the synopsis:

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- 2) Begin with a statement of purpose of the study, unless this is embodied in the title.
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ethics of investigation

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writing the paper

Present the news of your findings or a statement of the problem first, supporting details and arguments second. The significance of your work should be apparent to readers outside your field, even if you seem to explain too much to your colleagues. Avoid specialized laboratory jargon and abbreviations, but use technical terms as necessary, defining those likely to be known only in your field. Readers will skip a paper they do not understand.

Provide enough details of method and equipment so that another worker can repeat your work, but omit minute and comprehensive details which are generally known or which can be covered by citation of another paper.

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These should be cited consecutively in the text as superscript numerals and listed on a separate sheet in numerical order. Each reference should contain, in order, the following: author (last name, initials); title of article (lower case, no quotation marks); source, year of publication, volume, inclusive page numbers; abbreviations of journal names should conform to the *Index Medicus*. Following are examples of references:
