

Note on Ewe Orthography

ã, õ and ê are all nasalized vowels, like the French 'an' (in 'plan'), 'on' (in 'mon') and 'ain' (in 'pain') respectively

'fh' (phi in international phonetic alphabet) is a voiceless bilabial fricative

'vh' (beta in international phonetic alphabet) is a voiced bilabial fricative

ɖ is a voiced retroflex (apico-domal) stop

ŋ is a strongly nasalized 'ng' (as in 'sing')

x is a voiceless dorso-velar fricative, as the 'ch' in Lochness

ɔ is an open 'o', like the 'o' in 'order'.
