

## PRONUNCIATION GUIDE

Balinese and Indonesian	Approximate English equivalent
<i>a</i>	“a” in “father”
<i>e</i>	“e” in “bet”
<i>é</i>	“ay” in “sashay”
<i>i</i>	“ee” in “feeling”
<i>i</i> between two consonants in later syllables of a word (e.g., <i>ngematin</i> , <i>ngegongin</i> , <i>Alit</i> )	“i” in “lick” (with rare exceptions)
<i>o</i>	“o” in “rode”
<i>u</i>	“oo” in “food”
<i>c</i>	“ch” in “cheese”
<i>ç</i> (as in <i>Çudamani</i> )	“s” in “sunset”
<i>g</i>	“g” in “gorilla”
<i>j</i>	“j” in “juicy”
<i>ng</i>	“ng” in “singer”
<i>ngg</i>	“ng” in “finger”
