All manuscripts will undergo the standard peer-review process (single-blind, at least two independent reviewers). When entering your submission via the online submission system please choose "Special Issue: MSA". Submission of a manuscript implies that the work described has not been published before and is not under consideration for publication anywhere else.

The deadline for submissions is **October 31st, 2021**, but individual papers will be reviewed and published online on an ongoing basis.
