DESCRIPTION

Open Archaeology invites manuscripts for the Special Issue on Archaeology of Migration: Moving Beyond Historical Paradigms.

The aim of this Special Issue is to bring together papers that explore a variety of up-to-date paradigms, perspectives, and methodologies for visualizing human mobility in the past and present through the lens of material culture. We welcome contributions discussing all geographical regions and a chronological time frame from the Paleolithic through the present day.

We invite papers on topics related to (but not necessarily limited to):

- ▶ new theoretical models for understanding migration and mobility in the past,
- ▶ disciplinary histories/historiographies of approaches to migration and recent re-evaluations,
- ▶ scientific methodologies for detecting human mobility (aDNA, stable isotope analysis, etc.),
- ▶ discussion of the intersection of migrant identities with other socially-constructed identities, such as race, ethnicity, gender, status or class, etc.,
- ▶ scales of mobility, e.g. what it means to be local/non-local, variable distances and timeframes of migration, group vs individual movement.

HOW TO SUBMIT

The authors are kindly invited to submit their contribution via the online submission system Editorial Manager available at: <http://www.editorialmanager.com/opar/Default.aspx>

Please select the Category “**Archaeology of Migration**” to ensure that the manuscript is processed by the Guest Editors.

It is important that authors include a cover letter with their manuscript. The cover letter should explicitly state that the manuscript (or one with substantially the same content, by any of the authors) has not been previously published in any language anywhere and that it is not under simultaneous consideration or in press by another journal.

There are no specific length restrictions for the overall manuscript or individual sections; however, we urge the authors to present and discuss their findings in a concise and accessible manner. We recommend a length of 8,000–12,000 words, excluding the bibliography and figure captions.

Submission of a manuscript does not necessarily imply approval for its publication in this Open Archaeology special issue. The manuscript will be subjected to a peer review procedure managed by our esteemed Guest Editors and its acceptance will depend on this assessment.
