

**Instructions for Contributors****Scope**

Founded in 1958 "it" is the longest established German journal in the field of information technology.

Readers of the **it** are manufacturers and users of information technology, as well as students and scientists in the relevant disciplines. They expect qualified contributions depicting basic methods and applications, technologic trends, technologic-political aspects and issues of standardization. Hence, the editors ask you to:

- Pick a title that clearly reflects purpose and facts of your article. Reader grasp quickly if the paper is worthwhile reading.
- Introduce the problem comprehensibly. Describe the topical field and the state of the art.
- Emphasize the motivation and the goals of your studies.

**Electronical submission**

Authors are asked to submit their manuscript online at <http://www.editorialmanager.com/itit/>. The stylefile for preparing the manuscript (Word or Latex) is listed here. After registration you will be guided step by step through the submission process.

Publication language is English, therefore all papers should be written in English. From 2014 onwards title, abstract and keywords appear only in English.

**Your manuscript should contain:**

- Title
- Abstract
- Keywords
- Text body
- List of literature
- Short CV and photograph (customary) of the authors

**Length of the articles and further remarks**

- The length of a "free" article (including figures and tables) should be between four and eight printed pages.
- The length of a **contribution to a special issue** on a particular topic should be at most eight printed pages.
- The length of a **contribution to the category "Current Main Research Fields" and "Prized PhD Theses"** should be between two and four printed pages.
- A printed page without figures and tables consists of about 5,000 characters.
- Please use subtitles up to a depth of three, e.g., 1.2.1.

- Comment on new approaches and specialities and give an outlook on further developments. Point out advantages and utilities as well as possible applications.

- In a review article, it is important to distinguish between facts, scientific evaluation and personal opinion. Please draw attention to controversial views.

- Preferably cite primary literature, recent review articles and textbooks. The reference list should only contain entries cited in the text.

- For the reviewing process the open data (Latex or Word) plus the figure files are required.

- Forward **each figure** in a separate file, if possible as an -.eps or -.tiff file. The ideal resolution for photographic figures is 300 dpi, on the contrary for graphics it is 1.200 dpi. Make sure to indicate the position of the figures by implementing "Figure1", "Figure2" and so on in the figure filename.

- It is customary to picture all authors at the end of the paper.

- **Please make sure that all CVs** (up to 400 characters), **e-mail and postal addresses are included in the manuscript.** The author will receive an Online PDF of the published paper.

- The list of literature is alphabetically ordered using arabic numbers for enumeration. Insert the arabic numbers into square brackets.

- In the text, the citations appear [1] or [1; 4], for example.
