

Glossary of Names

- Amherst, Jeffrey (1717–96). Commander-in-chief of British forces in North America, 1757–63.
- Armstrong, Lawrence (1664–1739). Lieutenant-governor of Nova Scotia, 1725–39.
- Augustine, Michel. Mi'kmaq sakamaw of Richibucto who signed the 10 March 1760 treaty.
- Belcher, Jonathan [Snr] (1682–1757). Son of Andrew Belcher, governor of Massachusetts and New Hampshire, 1730–41, and governor of New Jersey, 1747–57.
- Belcher, Jonathan (1710–76). Son of Jonathan Belcher, lieutenant-governor of Nova Scotia, 1760–63.
- Biard, Pierre (1567–1622). French Jesuit priest who was in Mi'kma'ki from 1611 to 1613. His accounts of his time there are in the first three volumes of the *Jesuit Relations*.
- Bourg, Abram. Acadian deputy of Annapolis Royal who translated the English text of the 1726 into Mi'kmaq.
- Caulfeild, Thomas (1685–1717). Lieutenant-governor of the British garrison at Annapolis Royal, 1711–17.
- Cope, Jean-Baptiste. Mi'kmaq sakamaw of Shubenacadie who signed the 1752 treaty.
- Cornwallis, Edward (1713–76). Governor of Nova Scotia, April 1749 to October 1752.
- Denys, Nicolas (1598–1688). French fur trader who lived in Mi'kma'ki from about 1635 to 1670. His book, *The Description and Natural History of the Coasts of America*, published in 1672, is considered to be a valuable source.
- Doucett, John (??–1726). Lieutenant-governor of the British garrison at Annap-
